

9. All cross breeds will be entered in meat or "back yard bunny" classes.
10. Please notify the superintendent as to your cage needs for a doe with litter at least 48 hours prior to entry day.
11. Rabbits entered in wrong class will be changed to correct class at the discretion of the superintendent.

Dogs

1. Register and pay fee the day of the show. No preregistration accepted. Not a 4-H pre-registration.
2. No puppies under the age of 5 months unless a Service Dog.
3. All dogs must have proof of current vaccinations for Rabies and DHPP and present them to superintendent prior to judging.
4. Dogs must be on leash at all times. Leashes should be leather or fabric no longer than 6 ft. No flexible leashes.
5. Collars must be plain buckle or slip made of leather, fabric or chain. No pinch or shock collars allowed.
6. The owner assumes all and full responsibility for their dog's behavior.
7. Absolutely no females in heat the day of the show!
8. Any children under 12 years of age must be accompanied by an adult.

Crops & Horticulture

1. Sheave samples should be selected early. If samples are taken slightly before the grain is fully mature, much shattering will be avoided.
2. They can be cured hanging by the butts in a dark, airy room to retain the brightest color and prevent bleaching.
3. Carefully selected to get clean and straw free from rust, discoloration, or any disease, and having long-filled heads.
4. They must be tied in bundles two inches in diameter and bound at both ends and the middle with dark blue ribbon.
5. Avoid crushing the straw by tying it too tight.
6. Strip off all outside leaves to expose only the clean straw stem.
7. Hang bundles with heads down until ready to tie.
8. Sheaf samples should show the full length of straw.
9. Forage sheaves of grasses or legumes should be gathered at the stage when they are best suited for forage of hay purposes.
10. Alfalfa or clover that has reached or passed the full bloom stage, and Timothy or Brome that has passed the early bloom stage and leaves which have started to curl do not represent their own best feeding qualities.
11. After cutting, sheaf samples should be placed at once in a dark room, bundles can be made. If too brittle and dry, sprinkle the floor or table heavily with water and lay materials down for awhile, after which they can be handled without damage.
12. Plants should be food healthy and free from disease.
13. Forage sheaves should be tied with one tie only in the middle to give a well balance sheaf and should be three inches in diameter at the tie.
14. Peck samples will be required in grain, and one quart samples in grass seeds and clover.
15. All samples must be grown the year of the fair.
16. Grain samples will be judged for excellence in varietals characteristics, purity, freedom from smut and other diseases and from foreign matter, weed seed, dirt, and chaff.
17. Grains for threshed samples should be ripe before cutting, cured in straw and threshed without rain falling on them.
18. They should be thoroughly cleaned over fanning mill to remove dust, chaff, light kernels and weed seeds.
19. **Garden Baskets** consist of only 10 of the following varieties of vegetables, beet (3); beans, string (5 pods); cabbage (1 head); carrots (3); cauliflower (1 head); cucumbers (3); onions, no peeled (3); peas (5 pods); tomatoes (3); sweet corn (2); pumpkin (1); summer squash (1); winter squash (1).

20. Garden Collection Score Card

Number of vegetables, minimum of 10 varieties	35 pts
Number of fruit, minimum of 2 varieties	10 pts
Number of flowers (2) and herbs (3), minimum of 5 varieties	10 pts
General Appearance: Attractiveness, neatness and taste in design and decorations	35 pts

21. All entries in this division must only be entered in one class.
22. All entries in this division are judged by size, color, freedom, of blemish and trueness to type.
23. **Youth Garden** consist of at least 6 of the following, beet (3); beans, string (5 pods); cabbage (1 head); carrots (3); cauliflower (1 head); cucumbers (3); onions, no peeled (3); peas (5 pods); tomatoes (3); sweet corn (2); pumpkin (1); summer squash (1); winter squash (1). (Not to exceed 4' in width)
24. **Youth** cannot be entered in both youth and open classes.
25. **Advanced Display** one kind of vegetable, minimum of 6 varieties plus educational material.
26. Herbs must be displayed in glass containers except dill.

Floriculture

1. No exhibits in this department will be accepted on Friday morning.
2. Each entry to be displayed separately.
3. An exhibit of cut flowers will consist of at least 3 stems.
